


I hope that the past three-day weekend found everyone on a river somewhere fly-fishing. As usual, the Swederska household is non-stop and the holiday was filled up with a wedding, a 50^{th} , & 42^{nd} birthday parties. I was asked to be a substitute teacher for the dojo Friday night because of the bachelor party, which killed going anywhere on Friday. Vicky wanted to spend Saturday shopping for all the gifts needed for those upcoming occasions on Sunday and Monday. The only day I would have over the three-day weekend would be Saturday. Well that is when I thought Saturday would be a great day for me to head down and pick up trash on Blue Springs.

When I headed down to Blue Springs, I was thinking do I fish first or clean first? I tussled with this question until I got to Bourbon. I decided to clean first and if I had any time and energy left I would fish. When we agreed to maintain the access on Blue Springs I don't think that the others involve realized that there are six accesses to the creek. I started at the first access and worked my way down to the Meramec access. I picked up trash on both sides of Hwy N at all four accesses along with walking the paths to the creek. Since I am on this creek a lot of times over the last, oh say ten years I know where there is trash that is hard to get to and planned to clean that up also, such as cow legs that were dumped at an access about four years ago. Now they are just huge bones that I cleaned up, also the old tires on one path and just your normal plastic and glass trash that is thrown from cars on the Hwy. I also picked up all the trash from any waterway that comes from the Hwy because it all dumps into the creek when it rains.

When I got to the Meramec access it was full of canoes, people, and locals swimming. I minded my own business and started to pick up trash between the people. As I worked my way to the local people sitting in lawn chairs at the water's edge surrounded by beer cans, I thought here we go. I may look like a nerd and will have to fight my way out of this one. Then one of them called for me to come over

and that he had some cans for me to get. They all said that they pick up their trash and that all these cans were what they had been picking up that morning. I thanked them and started to place them in my bag. They could not thank me enough for donating my time to clean the access on a holiday. I looked over at the city people and noticed that they didn't care at all about what I was doing. Since this was my last access to clean and it had been about five hours into this project I decided to call it a day and fish. As I drove back to Hwy N down Blue Springs road (Thickety Road) I planned to just drop in there and fish up to the low water bridge and walk back. When I got there I saw a middle aged woman with her young daughter playing in the creek. So I decided to go to a different access. I fished, maybe about an hour and was too tired to go longer. As I was headed to Sullivan to dump the trash I passed the access that the women and young girl had been. OH MY GOD!!! They ate BBQ from Blue Springs Ranch and left all their trash right where their lawn chairs where placed. I had just cleaned this area to the ninth degree and now it did not even look like I was there, trash blowing everywhere. Just unbelievable!! I turned back around and filled another trash bag.



After five hours of work (not counting my hour of fishing) I am very happy with my day. I had made my mind up to clean stuff up that had been an eye sore for years. I did not care how nasty it was going to get but I got the job done and the accesses are much better off for it. If you decided to go pickup, I suggest wearing gloves, orange vest, and or a hat. I had my OFF T-shirt on when I picked up because I wanted people to know who was doing the cleaning. I did not think that I was going to be walking Hwy N. Also, LONG PANTS AND A LONG SLEEVE SHIRT. I used almost a full bottle of Deep Woods bug spray and came away with a few chiggers. Don't forget your water to drink or clean anything on your body you may need to clean fast. I also carry a decent first aid kit for all the OFF outings but if you plan to do this on your own you will need one. I wear high top boots because of snakes even though I've never seen one. Most of all let people know where you will be and when you plan to come back.

You do not have to take any classes to be a part of this Stream Team. You just have to want to do your part for our waterways. There will be a Blue Springs day coming up on September 20th. And we need lots of help with water quality sampling and most of all cutting and poisoning the Chinese Privet that is not indigenes to the area. We will be working with the MDC Forestry in this project. Please come down and help out. Please contact Bob Temper or me if you plan to help. Don't forget to dress for the work.

Fly of the Month – JuJuBee BWO Midge

Al Bourisaw introduced me to this pattern at last year's Montauk Outing. I believe it to be a Charlie Craven pattern, but who really knows. (Editor's note: see http://www.charliesflyboxinc.com/ or check out our new website!) What I do know is that it is relatively easy to tie for a small fly, very durable and just plain catches fish. Other color combinations work as well — Chartreuse and black, red and black, brown and black, olive and brown, etc. Use as the point-fly on the dropper as a nymph or fish it in the film as an emerger. Thanks Al!

Hook: TMC 2488 Size 18 – 20

Thread: 8/0 - 12/0 white for body and black for Thorax

Body: Two strands of olive and one strand of black Super Hair

Thorax: Black Tying Thread

Wing Case: White or Light Gray Flourofiver

Legs/Wings: Butts of Flourofiber folded back and trimmed

Start with white thread and wind one layer back to hook bend.

Even the ends of the Super Hair and tie in at the rear.

Move thread forward to the front third of the hook to form a very slim underbody. Wind all three strands of Super Hair at one time to form a smooth, even body to the thorax.

Tie off and clip the body and whip finish the white thread.

Start the black thread for the thorax.

Even the ends of the Flourofiber and tie in at the thorax.

Use the thread to build up a thorax.

Pull the Flourofiber over and tie down at the head to form the wing case.

Fold the Flourofiber back and bind back with a few wraps of thread and whip finish.

Slit the fibers down the sides and trim even with the end of the thorax.

Youth Conclave 2008 ---- DON'T MISS IT!



Mark your calendars right now for the Wayne & Catherine Moore Youth program for 2008 at the Southern Council Conclave – Saturday, October 4th


in Mountain Home, Arkansas at the fabled waters of Dry Run Creek.

Conservation

On Saturday, September 6 the Missouri Wilderness Coalition held a conference in Salem, Mo to plan steps to designate seven additional wild places in Missouri as 'Wilderness' areas. Wilderness designation is a Federal process, so a strategy was outlined to initiate the proposal to submit these unique areas for protection as Wilderness Areas.

Currently, only 4% of the national forest lands in Missouri are protected under this special designation ~ free of roads, motorized vehicles, mining, logging but open to hiking, camping, horseback riding, fishing and hunting. The proposal under consideration will designate an additional 3% (50,000 acres) for Wilderness in seven highly vulnerable areas that include: Big Spring, Lower Rock Creek, North Fork, Smith Creek, Spring Creek, Swan Creek and Van East Mountain.

The Missouri Wilderness coalition is an informal affiliation of organizations and individuals that support the protection of those areas that meet the specific criteria of the Federal National Wilderness Preservation System, most of which are found in the public land of Mark Twain National Forest, administered by the Forest Service. These areas meet the stringent criteria required for 'Wilderness' designation and are the only remaining areas identified as such. Keeping in mind, Mark Twain National Forest represents 1.5 million acres, this is a minimal amount of land that can receive this special designation ~ the most important provision for these areas to protect their wildness is the restriction of commercial development in the form of timber harvest (most of the proposed areas are not suitable for timber production) mining entry, road development and motorized intrusions. Most of these areas already come under the Forest Service's special regulations for Sensitive Areas, which do not permit most of these activities.

CAFO update: For those not attending our meeting last month, notice was given that a Cole county judge has ordered the DNR (Department of Natural Resources) to revoke the permit of a hog farm proposed near historic Arrow Rock. The ruling, which prohibits any CAFO (concentrated animal feed operation) within 15 miles of Arrow Rock will impact other areas of the state, since other CAFO's have been permitted near other State Park and historic sites. The conflict arises from DNR's responsibility for protecting state parks and historic sites, and yet granting permits for the CAFO operations (water quality permits for agricultural use). An example is DNR's approval of a permit for a chicken CAFO near Roaring River State Park.

We will follow this issue with interest to see how DNR will fulfill their responsibilities.
